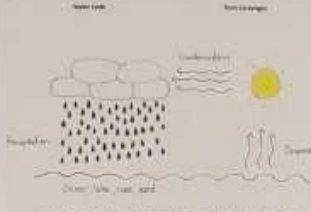


The Sun

Water Cycle



Water cycle: Evaporation, Condensation, Precipitation, Collection. The water cycle is the continuous process by which water moves from the earth's surface to the atmosphere and back. It is driven by the sun's energy, which causes water to evaporate from the surface. The water vapor then rises into the atmosphere, where it cools and condenses into clouds. When the clouds become heavy enough, they release the water as precipitation (rain or snow). The water then flows back to the surface through rivers, lakes, and oceans, completing the cycle.

Evolution



Evolution: The process by which organisms change over time. It is driven by natural selection, where organisms with traits that are better suited to their environment are more likely to survive and reproduce. Over time, these traits become more common in the population, leading to the evolution of new species.

The water cycle



There are two parts to the water cycle. Evaporation happens when water turns into a gas called water vapor. This water vapor rises into the air and cools. When it cools, it turns back into liquid water and falls to the ground as rain or snow. This is called precipitation. The water then flows back to the surface through rivers, lakes, and oceans, completing the cycle.

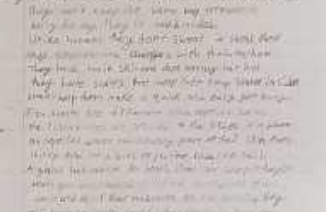
